Rural areas are key for the digital and green transitions.

- Rural areas are very diverse, facing different challenges and policy needs

« Giving Rural Actors Novel Data and Re-Usable Tools to Lead Public Action in Rural Areas »



Identify, develop and provide novel data and reusable tools to understand the characteristics, dynamics and drivers of rural areas and hence support place and evidence-based policy making.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

To conceptualise the **diversity** of features and functionalities of rural areas.

To develop **indicators** to better understand trends, threats and opportunities for rural areas.

To share knowledge and give rural actors **indicators** and tools for decision-making and support just, climate-neutral and inclusive transitions of rural areas.

To generate and assess **novel rural data** to support decision-making in rural areas.

To **engage with actors** across different types of rural areas to collect, analyse, validate and assess data.

To contribute to operationalise the **rural proofing** of policies.

GRANULAR will use **co-creation** and **participatory methods** in 16 pilot territories across Europe to capture the diversity of rural situations from a local perspective



GRANULAR RESULTS



7 Living Labs and 9 Replication Labs: to co-design tools, data and analyses to guide local decision-making.

Rural proofing: applied to 4 European policies.

Novel approaches for rural data: crowd-sourcing, citizen science, Earth observation, web-scraping, Internet of Things.

Briefs, reports and analyses: on thematic topics, European and national policies, rural proofing.



Rural Compass: unpacking rural diversity to guide public action.

Thematic topics: climate neutrality, socio-economic resilience, food systems, wellbeing, attractiveness.

Digital platform and repository: data and tools at different granularity.
















































