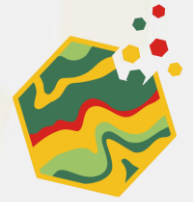

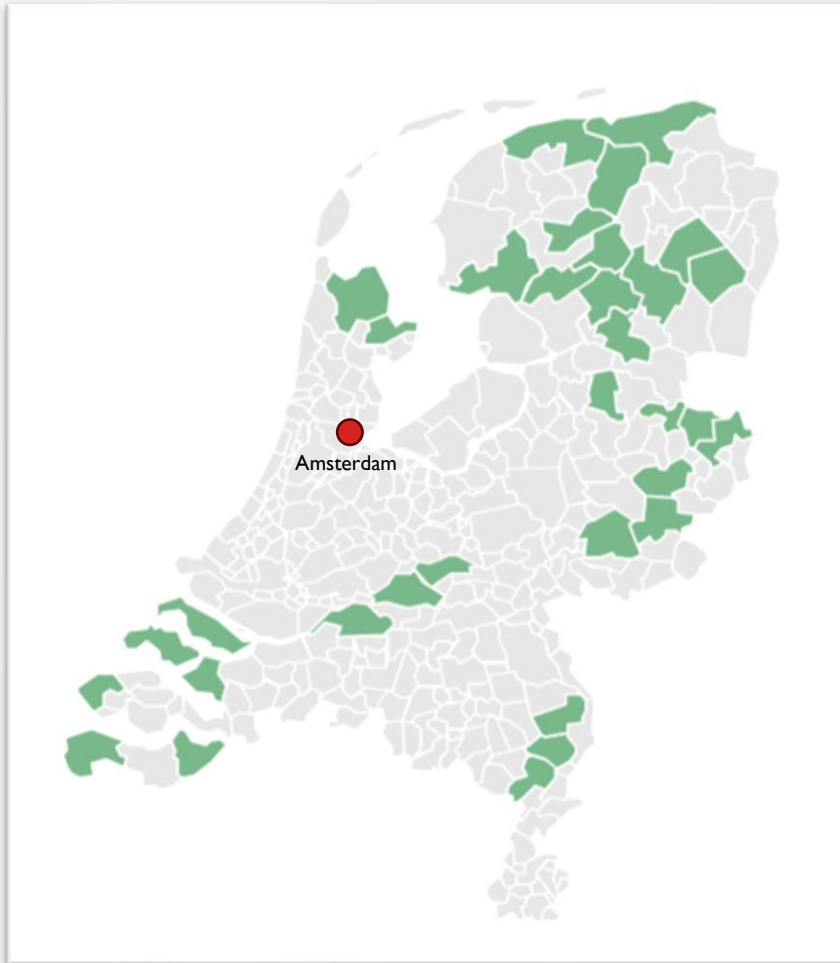

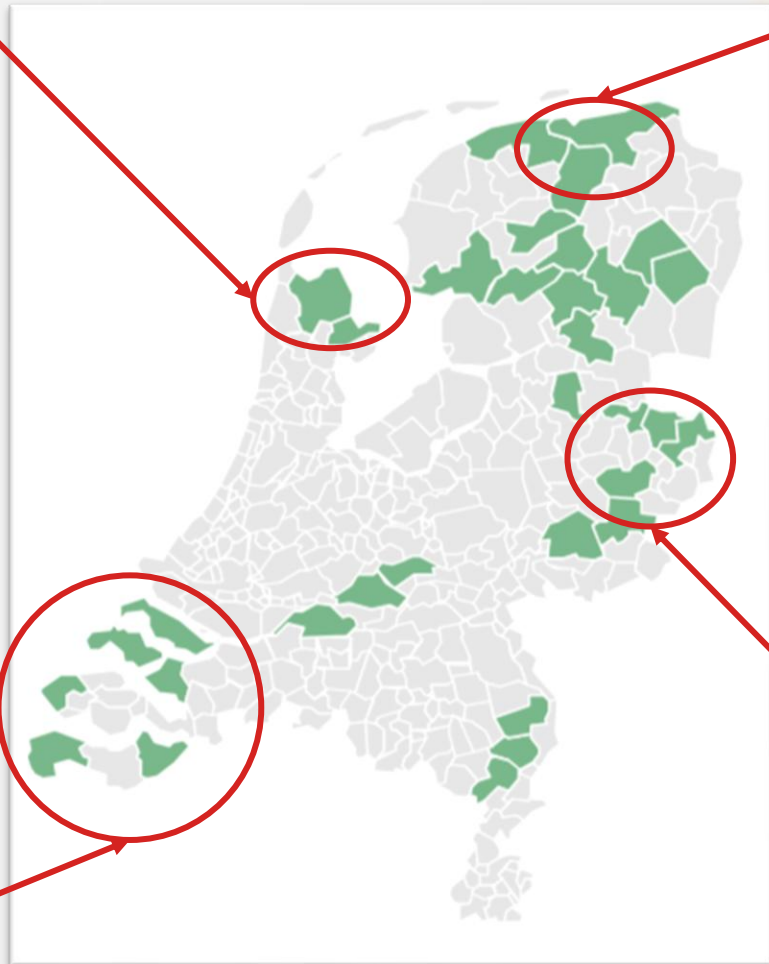
- Main actors in the LL: collaborating rural municipalities (P10) + Wageningen University and Research Centre

 - Collaboration with national Rural Pact network partners

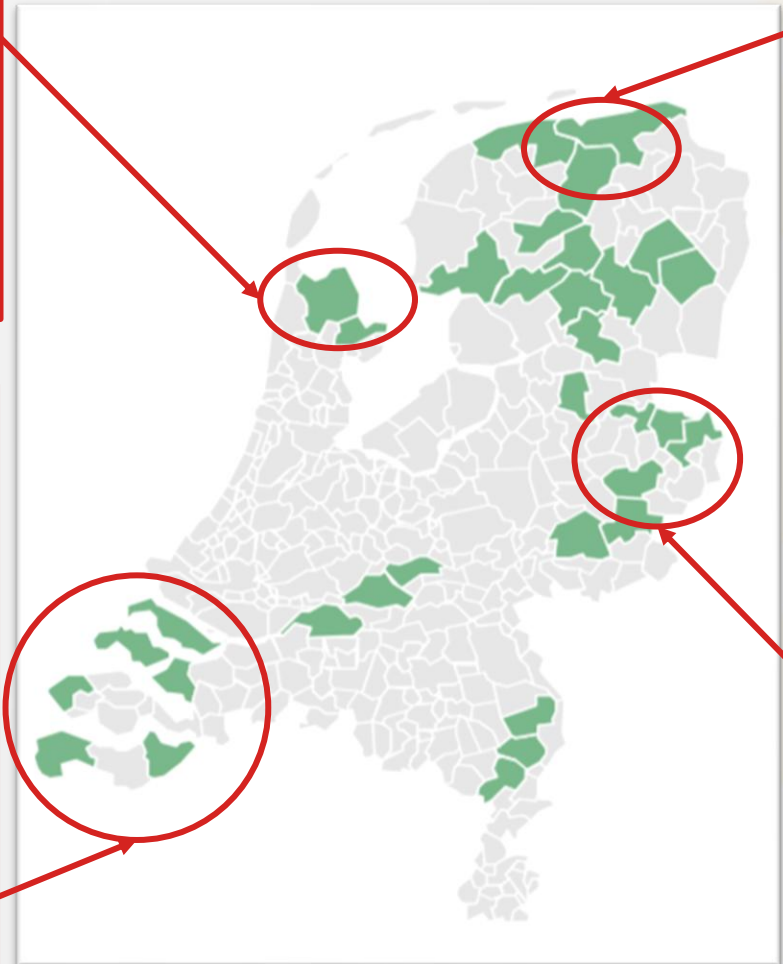

- Highlights of the report:
 - Municipal basic services concerns are increasingly differentiating across villages and social groups
 - Lots of data and indicators, but often with insufficient granularity and/or explanatory power for (sub-) municipal policy making
 - Combining and matching formal with informal datasourcing turns out to be key in municipal policy making processes

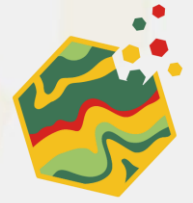
